









## IN FEDERAL COURT

Judge Ronald E. Meredith listened to arguments against the proposed agreement between members of the neighborhoods, the city and the Regional Airport Authority. The hearing which took place on Friday, August 23, 1991, lasted the good part of the day. During this hearing residents and former residents rejected the city's offer of 6.2 million, saying that it is not enough. Also, those who signed quitclaim deeds voiced there objection of being left out of the agreement. The business owners were represented and questioned the validity of the RAA buying this land for commercial use. Legal Aid lawyers, representing a number of tenants, also objected the agreement because tenants were left out. Judge Meredith has indicated he will rule on the objections in two to three weeks. It should be noted that the legal committees from the neighborhoods, the lawyers representing these members and the lawyers for the city and the RAA support the agreement.


