





HIGHLAND PARK EMERGENCY DEMOLITION

FACT SHEET

- As ordered by federal district court, 113 dwellings in Highland Fark will be demolished by the City.
- ** Asbestos removal will begin Thursday, April 25. Demolition will begin Monday, April 29./
- ** The City intends to complete demolition within the next 60 days. All basements will be backfilled, and property will be graded and seeded.
- Demolition activities will be managed to minimize intrusion or inconvenience for residents remaining in the area:

Streets will only be blocked as needed to get equipment onto property.

'During demolition, property will be watered to reduce dust.

Hours of operation for asbestos removal and demolition will be weekdays during daylight hours, weather permitting for demolition.

The City plans to backfill any open excavations by the end of each day.

- Each property will be inspected and certified as vacant on the day of demolition.
- ** The first properties to be demolished will be:

Work on these properties will be performed by Radco Asbestos Specialists and Robinson Wrecking Co. Another structure located at 310 East Southern Heights will also be taken down following extensive fire damage. It poses a danger of collapsing.

- ** Fifteen asbestos and demolition contractors pre-qualified by the City last year will be invited to bid on four packages of work among the remaining 109 dwellings.
- The City's cost for asbestos removal and demolition of the 113 properties is estimated to be \$500,000.
